INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP SUMMARY

The International Internship "Law, Digital Technologies and Sustainable Governance" is an academic and professional training programme aimed at strengthening international cooperation, promoting European standards in education and science, and providing participants with practical knowledge in the fields of law, digital technologies, sustainable governance, public administration, education, open science, academic integrity, and institutional development.

The Internship is implemented on the basis of Varna Free University "Chernorizets Hrabar", Bulgaria, which serves as the host academic institution for the programme. The participation of representatives of universities, research institutions, public authorities, courts, professional organizations, and civil society creates a multidisciplinary platform for the exchange of experience, the development of institutional partnerships, and the discussion of current challenges faced by education, science, justice, and governance in the context of European integration and global transformation.

The programme combines lectures, expert meetings, practical training sessions, thematic discussions, and professional communication with representatives of the host university. Special attention will be given to European approaches to digitalization, institutional resilience, sustainable governance, the rule of law, quality assurance in education, academic cooperation, and the development of international projects and partnerships.

Through its academic and applied components, the Internship provides participants with an opportunity to deepen their professional competencies, establish new international contacts, and explore practical models of cooperation with European educational and scientific institutions. The programme is also designed to support participants in understanding contemporary European approaches to institutional development, digital transformation, responsible governance, and international academic collaboration.

The International Internship will be implemented during the period from 23 March 2026

to 21 June 2026. Its offline component will take place from 13 to 21 June 2026 in Bulgaria, with the main programme activities hosted in Varna and the Golden Sands Resort.

All participants will receive a certificate of completion of the international internship issued by Varna Free University "Chernorizets Hrabar".
